



KNOW YOUR RIGHTS AT PROTESTS AND RALLIES

PRE-PROTEST

- Make a plan with someone you trust in case of arrest and make sure they have your...
 - Phone number
 - Full legal name
 - Date of birth
 - Country of origin
 - A copy of your current work permit, green card, or other proof of your lawful status

- Write down the number for the National Lawyer's Guild, in marker on your hand or arm if possible: 872-465-4244
- DO NOT go alone





KNOW YOUR RIGHTS AT PROTESTS AND RALLIES

DURING THE PROTEST

To protect yourself and others,

- · Be careful posting on social media
 - If you do, be mindful that law enforcement can use any pictures you post to identify people
- Consider wearing a mask for security and safety
- Consider turning off your phone
 - If you need to stay in contact with groups and others, you can decide to keep your phone on
- Keep in mind that the police can use facial recognition to unlock your phone, but cannot require you to type your pin or password
- Consider using encrypted apps such as Signal
- Remember you have the right not to talk to the police or give them any identifying information





KNOW YOUR RIGHTS AT PROTESTS AND RALLIES

IF YOU ARE ARRESTED

- Remember you have a right to remain silent
- You can call the National Lawyer's Guild at 872-465-4244
- If you are arrested by ICE you can call your emergency contact and ask them to alert ICIRR or OCAD at 855-435-7693 or call an immigration attorney
- Keep in mind that police and ICE might record calls you make on their phones and use information you discuss in those calls
- Remember it is your right to NOT sign any documents
- Inform your lawyer on your immigration status
